March 5, 2010 Wagons West- Dr. Albert J. Klee

Dr. Albert J. Klee takes us on a photographic pilgrimage to the western areas of the U.S., from the Continental Divide and the States of Montana, Idaho, Wyoming, and Colorado, to the Southwest where we continue our travels through Nevada, Utah, New Mexico and Arizona. The emphasis is on its spectacular scenery, flowers and, in particular, its fascinating wildlife.

***March 12, 2010 Wandering The West - Fr. Dale Peterka (@Winton Woods)**

'Wandering the West' takes us west on three major highways from Chicago to the Pacific. We explore Route 66, the Lincoln Highway, and US Route 2. We go through fourteen states, visit five National Parks, and see lots of mountains with a few motorcycle, train pictures and aerial shots for variety. This program shows highlights of several different trips taken by motorcycle, car and train and is accompanied by a recorded sound track.

March 19, 2010 Cruising the Mediterranean- Cliff Goosmann

Come along as Cliff takes us on a cruise to nine European ports on the Mediterranean without having to unpack. We embark from Barcelona and make stops in Nice, Florence, Rome, Naples, Santorini, Athens, Dubrovnik and Venice. We will explore what makes each of these cities unique. We get to experience life at sea and enjoy the view from the ship as we cruise into the port of Venice.

March 26, 2010 Cruising the Canals of North America- Alan Lloyd

Captain Alan Lloyd navigated on the Erie and other canals from New York to Montreal cruising through scenic areas and visiting sites rich in history. Come and relive the adventure as you travel or anchor in the same waters as did Henry Hudson, Samuel de Champlain and Benedict Arnold.

***April 9, 2010 A Journey Through East Africa- Dr. Albert J. Klee (@Winton Woods)**

Dr. Klee takes us through Kenya, Tanzania, Zambia, Botswana, Zimbabwe, and South Africa during a five-week journey overland in an old Bedford army truck. The focus is on the birds, animals, and peoples of these regions showing the subjects in detail and close-up, from the spectacular bee-eaters and weavers, to leopards and cheetahs, and down to the smallest of mammals, the dik-dik, and mongoose. The Masai, Samburu, and N'debele tribes are visited, as well as the mysterious Zimbabwe ruins.

April 16, 2010 The Many Colors of Nova Scotia- Barb Farber

Nova Scotia is a province of Canada which is so far east that it is in a time zone which puts it an hour ahead of Eastern Time. As one of the Maritime islands, its location gives it a unique place in geography and history. This program shows a mixture of the past and the present and a culture that sometimes looks like a moment frozen in time.

April 23 2010 October Light: Landscapes of California's Eastern Sierras- Mike Rank

John Muir called the Sierras the "Range of Light". Mike's presentation will showcase images of the landscape and sky created during an October 2009 photo workshop in the Eastern Sierras, the Owens Valley, White Mountains and Mono Basin. Twelve inches of snow fell on Tuesday putting a white cap on everything above nine thousand feet, making the autumn colors in the Aspens quite spectacular. The high winds made for wonderful clouds and deep blue skies after the storm cleared.

April 30, 2010 China - Old and New- Ernie Zimmerman

Ernie will show China from the early emperors to the startling changes that have occurred in modern times. Sights seen are Tiananmen Square, the site of the 20th century uprising adjacent to the Forbidden City, home of the extravagant living quarters of the emperors, and the Great Wall of China, all in Beijing. Xian houses the astounding Terra Cotta Warriors. Shanghai and Hong Kong also show the exotic architecture, old and new. The friendly Chinese people, living on both ancient farms and modern quarters are documented.
